Planning for disaster response is not enough

Keynote speaker: **Bruce Esplin, Emergency Services Commissioner, Victoria**

Bruce Esplin was appointed Victoria's first Emergency Services Commissioner in June 2000. Bruce is an advocate for an inclusive approach to emergency management, and encourages collaborative partnerships between community, all levels of government, the emergency services and the private sector. He has played a central role in the whole of government response to many major emergencies in Victoria and has conducted a number of independent, highly sensitive inquiries into the activities of government agencies and the appropriateness of the state's emergency management arrangements, including: *the Inquiry into the 2002-2003 Bushfires (2003)*, *the Examination of Prescribed Burning Practices - Wilsons Promontory (2005)*, *Improving Emergency Response at Melbourne Airport (2005)*, *the Westpoint Chemical Fire Report to the Community (2008)* and *the Review of the April 2008 Windstorm*. More recently, Bruce played a key leadership role following the 2009 Black Saturday bushfires.

Bruce maintains an ongoing, passionate commitment to the emergency management sector and holds a vision for progressive emergency management arrangements where communities are not passive recipients of services, but active participants in their own safety planning and decision making. He is a committed advocate for change in the emergency management sector.

Presentation Overview:

The events of the past summer may have given us a glimpse of what some might determine to be the future riskscape confronting Australia. An environment which can evolve rapidly into one which is both demanding and complex, and one which tests an organisation's capacity to manage current challenges and prepare for those not yet faced.

Commissioner Esplin will discuss organisational agility in risk management focusing on the new Australian riskscape - a riskscape which demands a rebalance to prevention and mitigation, and which commands the question of the cost of not doing, rather than doing.
